## Vintage Railway Streetcar Trolley

*This nostalgic Trolley Car which originally ran in Butte in the late 1800s to early 1900s, has been completely rebuilt into a fully functional 1-bedroom cabin! All of the hard work has been done for you. Its ready to move onto your property for your fall guests or hunting buddies to stay in! Your guests will be talking about your one-of-a-kind accommodations for years to come! Cozy comfort with all of the necessities and then some! Complete with a kitchenette, bathroom with shower, and queen sized bedroom! Other comforts include a warm inviting natural wood interior, 44 stained glass 'sky-lights', easy to clean wood flooring, tiled shower, refrigerator, stove, and plenty of natural lighting from ample windows! Exterior is knotty-pine tongue & groove siding and comes complete with the original under-carriage in place! Guest accommodations don't get any more unique than this! This is Trolley #12 and was the last one in service. Original parts from all of the other trollies were used in the restoration of this one. Trolley is approximately 7'w x 37'l.*

(1906) "Owned and operated by the Electric Street and Railway Co., streetcars first ran in 1888 from Butte to Walkerville at a 17 percent grade. The railway provided a clean, dry roadway for teams when the rest of the street was knee-deep in mud. In 1908, the line had over 40 miles of track. Among its 49 cars was a special sight-seeing car offering a three-and-a-half hour tour through the city to such sites as W.A. Clark's smelter, the surface workings of one of the big mines, and the Columbia Gardens. The cars ran from Walkerville to Lake Avoca (now the County Club area) and from West Park to the Gardens. Streetcars were replaced with buses in 1937."
